

Accommodation and Prices

Prices consist of accommodation costs plus the course fee of £140, discounted to £70 for Individual Members and members of Affiliated Choirs. For all others (including Friends), the higher price in brackets applies.

Residential Rates

All residential rates are per person and include the course fee, resources and full board.

Superior Residential Package

Canterbury Cathedral Lodge provides an excellent 4* hotel service with en-suite rooms and breakfast. Lunch will be taken at the Lodge, and evening meals at King's School. Rooms are limited and will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.

Standard Residential Package

Lanfranc House in Christ Church University is 5-10 minutes walk from the Lodge (a limited minibus service will be provided at the start and end of the day). All rooms have en-suite shower rooms, and shared kitchens will be stocked with simple breakfast items for delegates to prepare their own breakfasts. Lunch will be taken at the Lodge, and evening meals at King's School.

Location *In the footsteps of pilgrims*

Canterbury is a World Heritage Site, with plenty to see including two castles, an abbey founded in 597AD, the oldest parish church in England still in constant use, and many historical museums.

It is less than 1 hr 30 mins by train from central London, less than 20 mins from Ashford International Station (Eurostar), and only 20 mins from Dover ferry terminal. Both Heathrow and Gatwick Airports run express trains into central London where delegates can take a direct train to Canterbury.
