

## Sunday by Sunday on the web Celebrating the Saints

The music suggested here has been selected to help those planning services held on days when individual saints are celebrated, complementing the music for All Saints' Day listed on pages 28 and 29 of *Sunday by Sunday* Issue 57. The focus is chiefly, though not exclusively, on apostles and evangelists and on saints honoured particularly in the British Isles.

Lists of music in honour of the Blessed Virgin Mary can be found in a separate document on this website. Ideas for music celebrating St Michael and All Angels will be included in *Sunday by Sunday* Issue 64 in 2013, when 29 September falls on a Sunday.

*The Voice of Faith* (VOF) is a helpful book of hymns by Timothy Dudley-Smith, including a number for specific saints' days or patronal festivals (Canterbury Press 2008). The music editor is William Llewellyn. *Hymns for Prayer and Praise* (HPP), currently out of print, is to be reissued in a revised edition with slightly different numbering.
