

## **Sunday by Sunday**

### **Resources for Music Sunday and other celebrations of the ministry of musicians**

#### **Introduction** *(first published in Sunday by Sunday Issue 41)*

There was once a time when music ministry equalled ‘church organist’ (and often not much else!). Times have changed, though; today, alongside the established roles of organist and choir leader, we find music co-ordinators, worship group leaders, and directors of music. This has something to do with the broadening of style in music for worship – but at its root it signals a healthy rediscovery of two important principles:

- First, that all the people of God are called to ministry.
- Second, that musicians are ministers and not simply people who ‘do a job’.

These principles are enshrined within the Biblical patterns of ministry we have inherited.

#### ***The Old Testament***

For the Israelites, music was a vital part of worship, especially in the Temple. Their ‘professional’ musicians – Levites – were appointed for their musical skill but also to fulfil a priestly function within Temple worship. The writer of 1 Chronicles gives us a wonderful account of some of the resources used in the Temple [1 Chronicles 15: 16ff].

What is particularly interesting is the note about the appointment of Chenaniah as ‘Director of Music’. He was appointed to the post ‘because he understood it’ [1 Chronicles 15:22]. In other words, he was not simply a skilled musician, but had a special gifting in musical leadership for worship. I often think that this passage should be read at the inauguration services for all new church music leaders!

#### ***The New Testament***

The New Testament tells us very little at all about music in worship, other than to ‘sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs’ [Colossians 3:16]. But this must be read against two important emphases:

- The first is the call to the whole baptized people of God to share in ministry as a means of furthering God’s mission in the world.
- The second is Paul’s injunction that everything be done ‘decently and in order’ [1 Corinthians 14].

This points towards an understanding of music ministry in which, whilst order (and leadership) is important, the ministry of all musicians is to be valued as part of the total ministry of the baptized.

## **Ministry and worship teams**

In some places, musicians are now taking their place as members of a local ‘ministry team’ along with those who are ordained / licensed ministries, or who have particular roles in pastoral care, teaching or evangelism. The Canons of the Church of England point to a view of music ministry as a collaborative exercise in which ordained and licensed ministers and musicians engage in dialogue and joint planning.

## **Recognition and Inauguration**

It is vital, as with any ministry of leadership in the Church, that the person called and appointed to the ministry is recognized by the local church and that their ministry is inaugurated with prayer and commissioning, within the context of worship. Without this, there is a real danger (with organists in particular) that musical ministry is ‘heard but not seen’, with the musician becoming a faceless functionary rather than a visible member of a church’s ministry team.

The recognition of musicians applies not only to directors. It is the tradition in many places to hold an admission ceremony, with prayer, for new members of a choir. This can easily be adapted to include others involved on a regular basis in music ministry in churches which do not have a formal choir: worship group singers and instrumentalists, band members etc.
